

Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal Presented to Two BC Notaries

Two BC Notaries recently received the Commemorative Medal for the Golden Jubilee of **Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II**.

The medal was created to mark the 50th anniversary of the accession of Her Majesty to the Throne on February 6, 1952.
