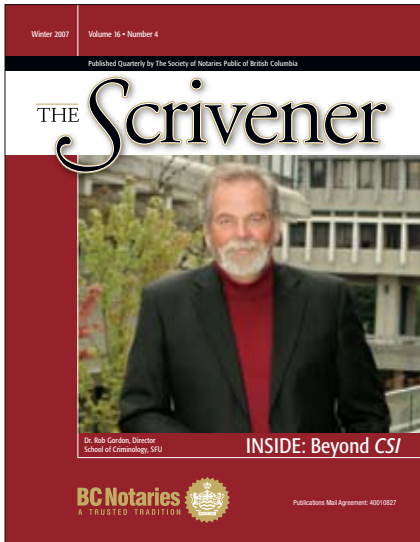


Letters
