real need in the community. He enjoys helping the public, and obtains a real sense of satisfaction from doing so.

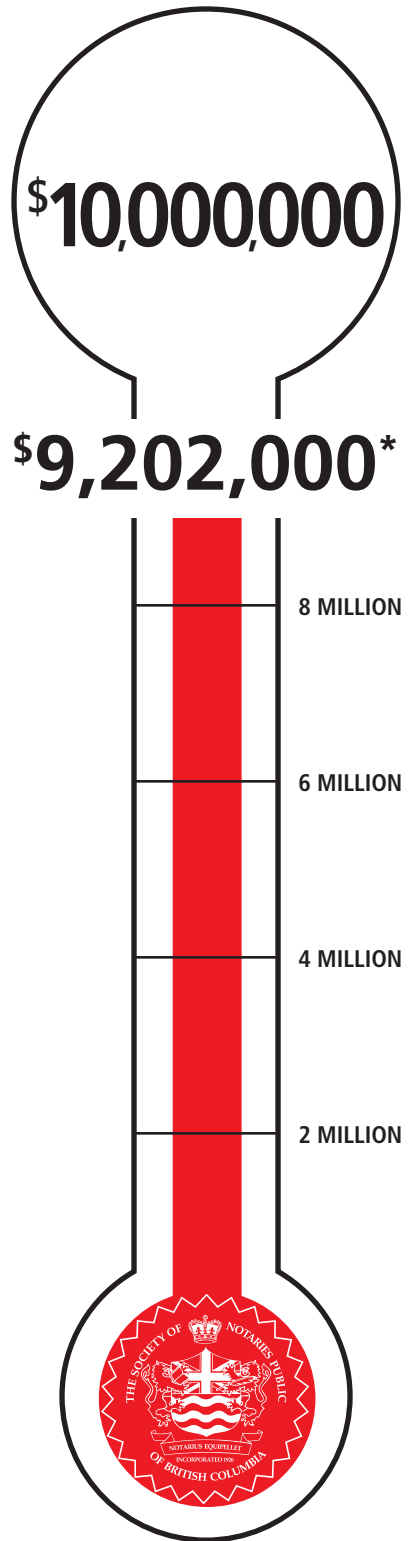
He has served on the Board of Governors of The Notary Foundation for eight years. Chris finds his service on the Board is a great way to give back to various people and organizations in a very positive way.
